## **ADDENDUM**

### **Further Information provided by the Parties in accordance with Article 7 of the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer**

#### **Introduction**

1. The present report contains information received by the Secretariat between 18 October 2004 and 11 November 2004, and therefore supplements or corrects information that was presented in document UNEP/OzL.Pro.16/4.
2. The following are annexed to the present report:
  - Annexes I: 2003 Additional data on production and consumption reported by the Parties;
  - Annex II: 2003 Corrected\*\* data on production and consumption reported by the Parties;
  - Annex III: 2003\*\*\* Data reported for laboratory and analytical uses.

\*\* Included in the annex are only corrected data that impact on the compliance status of the given Parties.

\*\*\* Laboratory and analytical uses for 2003 are provided in this document because they were not included in document UNEP/OzL.Pro.16/4. Annex V of the document listed laboratory and analytical uses for 2002 instead of the data for 2003.

**A. Status of ratification of the Montreal Protocol and its London, Copenhagen, Montreal and Beijing amendments**

3. Since the release of document UNEP/OzL.Pro.16/4, only one new ratification has been received, this being from Italy which ratified the Beijing Amendment on 22 October 2004.

**B. Status of compliance with annual data reporting requirements (Article 7, paragraphs 3 and 4)**

4. Since the release of document UNEP/OzL.Pro.16/4, Indonesia reported all of its outstanding data for the year 1999.
5. Further, the following Parties that had not reported data for 2003 have now reported.
