Market introduction of natural refrigerants: Lessons from 27 years of Montreal Protocol implementation in Kenya

Kenya has made considerable achievements in the Montreal Protocol implementation: CFCs were completely phased-out in 2010, and they were followed by halons and methyl bromide. As replacements, natural refrigerants were introduced into the Kenyan market. What made these achievements possible? Kenyan stakeholders and the implementing agency GIZ look back to 27 years of cooperation, reflecting on the effectiveness of the different measures they have put into practice.
