



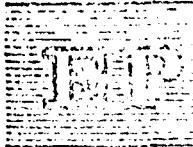

DRAFT ANNEX CONCERNING MEASURES TO CONTROL, LIMIT AND REDUCE THE USE  
AND EMISSIONS OF FULLY HALOGENATED CHLOROFLUOROCARBONS (CFCs)  
FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE OZONE LAYER, SUBMITTED BY  
FINLAND, NORWAY AND SWEDEN

Summary of comments by Governments

Further to the comments summarized in document UNEP/WG.94/4/Add.1, the following additional replies were received to the letter of 14 July 1983 from the Executive Director of UNEP to Governments, soliciting comments on the proposed annex:

CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC

[4 October 1983]

Government indicates approval concerning regulation and control of CFCs submitted by Finland, Norway and Sweden, referred to in paragraph 36 (c) of the report.

DJIBOUTI

[Original: French]

[22 September 1983]

The Government has no objections to the draft annex concerning regulation and control of CFCs (chlorofluorocarbons) submitted by Finland, Norway and Sweden.

KENYA

[Original: English]

[23 September 1983]

Draft Article 1: While Kenya would leave States to state what they consider to be essential uses, an attempt should be made to provide for an objective and uniform criteria so that the Convention can apply in a uniform manner to all contracting parties.

Draft Article 2: The provision of assistance to developing countries is not clearly set out and in any case would seem to be narrowed down to the limitation of emission in the sectors of foam plastics, refrigeration, solvents and others. However, the needs of developing countries are much broader and include all aspects which would enable to protect the ozone layer. The article would need to be amended to enable developing countries to develop capabilities relevant to their rights and obligations in this sphere.

Draft Article 3: Kenya supports the text in its present form.
