**I. Introduction**

1. The present addendum summarizes the additional information related to compliance with the control measures (Articles 2A–2J and Article 5) and reporting obligations (Article 7) received by the Secretariat as at 10 October 2024, after the preparation of the report on information provided by parties in accordance with Articles 7 and 9 of the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer (UNEP/OzL.Pro.36/6–UNEP/OzL.Pro/ImpCom/73/2). The addendum supplements and updates the information in that report.

## II. Information provided by parties

### A. Status of compliance with annual and hydrofluorocarbon baseline data reporting requirements (Article 7, paras. 2, 3, 3 bis and 3 ter)

2. For 2023, an additional 40 parties submitted their Article 7 data, bringing the total number of parties that have submitted their Article 7 data to 171 (127 parties operating under paragraph 1 of Article 5 and 44 not so operating). The data for those additional parties are set out in annex I to the present document. Of the total number of parties that have submitted their Article 7 data, 162 parties reported their data by 30 September 2024.

3. The parties that have not yet submitted data for 2023 as required under paragraph 3 of Article 7 are Angola, Austria, Azerbaijan, Burkina Faso, China, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Djibouti, Egypt, Ethiopia, Grenada, Haiti, Iceland, Mali, Namibia, Nicaragua, Papua New Guinea, the Republic of Moldova, Saint Kitts and Nevis, San Marino, Somalia, the State of Palestine, Sudan, Suriname, Tajikistan, Tunisia, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United Republic of Tanzania.

4. San Marino, which was listed in document UNEP/OzL.Pro.36/6–UNEP/OzL.Pro/ImpCom/73/2 as having outstanding hydrofluorocarbon data for the years 2021 and 2022, has since submitted the required information. Similarly, Thailand, which was listed as having outstanding hydrofluorocarbon baseline data for the years 2020 to 2022, has since submitted the required information.

5. On the basis of the information contained in document UNEP/OzL.Pro.36/6–UNEP/OzL.Pro/ImpCom/73/2 and in the present addendum, and in conformity with existing practice, the Implementation Committee may wish to forward for consideration by the Thirty-Sixth Meeting of the Parties the draft decision set out in annex II to the present addendum, on the understanding that the Secretariat, in consultation with the President of the Implementation Committee, may remove from the decision text those parties that submit their data before the decision is adopted, making any other consequential adjustments to the numbers and paragraphs of the decision.

### B. Status of compliance with the control measures for 2023

6. The following table lists the additional cases reported to date of consumption of ozone-depleting substances for 2023 that exceed the prescribed limits, together with explanations or clarifications provided by the Secretariat or by the party, as applicable.

## Annex II

### **Draft decision XXXVI/[--]: Data and information provided by the parties in accordance with Article 7 of the Montreal Protocol**

*The Thirty-Sixth Meeting of the Parties decides:*

1. To note that 171 parties of the 198 parties that should have reported data for 2023 have done so, and that 162 of those parties had reported their data by 30 September 2024 as required under paragraph 3 of Article 7 of the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer;
2. To note with appreciation that 79 of the reporting parties submitted their data for 2023 by 30 June 2024, in accordance with the encouragement in decision XV/15, and that reporting by 30 June each year greatly facilitates the work of the Executive Committee of the Multilateral Fund for the Implementation of the Montreal Protocol in assisting parties operating under paragraph 1 of Article 5 of the Protocol to comply with the Protocol's control measures;
3. To note with concern that 27 parties, namely Angola, Austria, Azerbaijan, Burkina Faso, China, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Djibouti, Egypt, Ethiopia, Grenada, Haiti, Iceland, Mali, Namibia, Nicaragua, Papua New Guinea, the Republic of Moldova, Saint Kitts and Nevis, San Marino, Somalia, the State of Palestine, Sudan, Suriname, Tajikistan, Tunisia, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the United Republic of Tanzania, have not reported their data for 2023 as required under paragraph 3 of Article 7 of the Montreal Protocol, and that this places them in non-compliance with their data reporting obligations under the Protocol until such time as the Secretariat receives their outstanding data;
4. To also note with concern that three parties operating under paragraph 1 of Article 5, namely Djibouti, Egypt and Eritrea, that have ratified the Kigali Amendment to the Montreal Protocol and should have submitted baseline data for Annex F substances (hydrofluorocarbons) for the years 2020 to 2022 have not done so as required under paragraph 2 of Article 7 of the Montreal Protocol, and that this places those parties in non-compliance with their data reporting obligations under the Protocol until such time as the Secretariat receives their outstanding baseline data for hydrofluorocarbons;
5. To further note with concern that three parties operating under paragraph 1 of Article 5, namely Côte d'Ivoire, Eritrea and Guinea, that have ratified the Kigali Amendment to the Montreal Protocol and are thus required to submit data on Annex F substances (hydrofluorocarbons) for 2023 submitted data for other controlled substances but not for hydrofluorocarbons, as required under paragraph 3 of Article 7 of the Montreal Protocol, and that this places those parties in non-compliance with their data reporting obligations under the Montreal Protocol until such time as the Secretariat receives their outstanding data for hydrofluorocarbons;
6. To note that a lack of timely data reporting by parties impedes the effective monitoring and assessment of parties' compliance with their obligations under the Montreal Protocol;
7. To urge the parties listed in paragraphs 3, 4 and 5 above to report the required data to the Secretariat as soon as possible;
8. To request the Implementation Committee under the Non-Compliance Procedure for the Montreal Protocol to review the situation of those parties at its seventy-fourth meeting;
9. To encourage parties to continue to report consumption and production data as soon as the figures are available, and preferably by 30 June each year, as encouraged in decision XV/15 and subsequent decisions on the matter.
