Indicative financial report on the trust funds for the Vienna Convention for the Protection of the Ozone Layer and the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer for the fiscal year 2018 as at 30 April 2018

Note by the Secretariat

I. Introduction

1. By paragraph 13 of decision XX/20, the parties to the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer requested the Secretariat to inform the Open-ended Working Group about all sources of income received, including the reserve, fund balance and interest, as well as actual and projected expenditures and commitments. The parties also requested the Executive Secretary to provide an indicative report on all expenditures against the agreed budget lines.
2. Pursuant to that decision, the Secretariat is circulating herewith the present note as information for the Open-ended Working Group at its fortieth meeting.
3. The present note provides information as at 30 April 2018 on the status of the trust funds for the Vienna Convention for the Protection of the Ozone Layer and for the Montreal Protocol. Section II provides information on the sources of income received. Section III provides information on the reserves, fund balance and interest. Section IV provides information on the expenditures and commitments against the approved budgets for the fiscal year 2018.
4. The present note should be read in conjunction with the proposed revision to the approved 2018 budget and the proposed budgets for 2019 and 2020 for the Trust Fund for the Montreal Protocol (UNEP/OzL.Pro/30/4) and the financial report on the trust funds for the Vienna Convention and the Montreal Protocol for the fiscal year 2017 (UNEP/OzL.Pro.30/5). The financial report, which traditionally has been presented as an addendum to the note by the secretariat on the proposed revision to the approved budget for a specific year and the proposed budgets for the following two years, includes the certified financial statements for the trust funds for the Vienna Convention and the Montreal Protocol, the earmarked contributions that support the activities of the Ozone Secretariat and the budget performance reports for the fiscal year 2017 for both trust funds. Advance versions of documents UNEP/OzL.Pro/30/4 and UNEP/OzL.Pro.30/5 on the budget and the financial report, respectively, are provided for the information of the Open-ended Working Group at its fortieth meeting.
5. In both the text and tables of the present note, all references to dollars (\$) are to United States dollars, unless otherwise stated.

II. Status of contributions and other income

6. Section A of annex I to the present note shows the status of contributions to the Trust Fund for the Vienna Convention as at 30 April 2018. The outstanding contributions at that date amounted to \$1,101,705, of which \$636,380 was for 2017 and prior years and \$465,325 was for 2018.

7. The outstanding contributions balance as at 31 December 2017 was \$639,771 (see UNEP.OzL.Pro.30/5). The total assessed voluntary contributions for 2018 amounted to \$733,000. During the first four months of 2018, \$267,562 was received from parties, of which \$3,391 was for 2017 and prior years and \$264,171 was for 2018. Together with advance payments from 2017 of \$5,403 applied to the 2018 contributions, this brings the outstanding balance as at 30 April 2018 to \$1,101,705.

8. Section B of annex I to the present note shows the status of contributions to the Trust Fund for the Montreal Protocol as at 30 April 2018. The outstanding contributions at that date amounted to \$4,958,368, of which \$1,961,493 was for 2017 and prior years and \$2,996,875 was for 2018.

9. The balance of outstanding contributions as at 31 December 2017 was \$2,985,285 (see UNEP.OzL.Pro.30/5). Total assessed voluntary contributions for 2018 amounted to \$5,546,722. During the first four months of 2018, a total of \$3,554,568 was received from parties, of which \$1,023,792 was for 2017 and prior years and \$2,530,776 was for 2018. Together with advance payments from 2017 of \$19,071 applied to the 2018 contributions, this brings the outstanding balance as at 30 April 2018 to \$4,958,368.

10. As requested in paragraph 9 of decision XI/3 and paragraph 8 of decision XXIX/24 of the joint eleventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Vienna Convention and the Twenty-Ninth meeting of the Parties to the Montreal Protocol, the Secretariat, in the first quarter of 2018, contacted parties with outstanding contributions for the trust funds for the Vienna Convention and the Montreal Protocol for 2017 and prior years with a view to finding a way forward. In addition, the President of the Conference of the Parties to the Vienna Convention and the President of the Meeting of the Parties to the Montreal Protocol, in conjunction with the Secretariat, will write to those parties whose contributions are still outstanding with regard to that issue during the second half of 2018.

11. The Secretariat will report on the progress achieved in those efforts to the Conference of the Parties at its twelfth meeting and the Thirtieth Meeting of the Parties.

12. The earmarked contributions received in the first four months of the fiscal year 2018 are listed in table 1.

13. In paragraph 11 of decision XI/3 and paragraph 10 of decision XXIX/24, the parties requested the Secretariat to fully utilize the programme support costs available to it in 2018 and later years and, where possible, to offset those costs against the administrative components of the approved budget of the trust funds. The United Nations Environment Programme has allocated \$394,698 to the Ozone Secretariat for the programme support cost budget for the fiscal year 2018.

14. The Secretariat would like to bring to the attention of the parties that the 2017 programme support cost budget of \$622,000 included an overallocation of \$136,656 owing to a technical error in the enterprise resource planning system (Umoja), which used an average effective rate of 16 per cent to calculate the programme support costs of the trust funds instead of the established 13 per cent. The issue has since been rectified and the 2018 programme support cost allocation of \$394,698 is based on 13 per cent of the 2017 expenditure of the two trust funds and the established percentages of the earmarked contributions.

15. The Secretariat will fully utilize this amount to cover administrative costs, including the development of the online data reporting tool and salaries for staff with administrative roles.

III. Reserves, fund balance and interest

16. Table 2 shows the reserves and fund balances for the trust funds for the Vienna Convention and the Montreal Protocol as at 30 April 2018.

17. The reserves and fund balance for the Trust Fund for the Vienna Convention as at 31 December 2017 was \$1,828,107, which includes cash, cash equivalents, investments and non-current investments. A detailed explanation of the reserves and fund balance will be provided in the financial report for the trust funds for the Vienna Convention and the Montreal Protocol for the fiscal year 2017 (UNEP.OzL.Pro.30/5). In brief, that balance is the result of low budget utilization in 2017 due mainly to (a) contributions by the Government of Canada for hosting the joint eleventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Vienna Convention and the Twenty-Ninth Meeting of the Parties to the Montreal Protocol, and (b) parties paying their contributions in arrears. The reserves and fund balance as at 30 April 2018 (table 2) is derived from the reserves and fund balance as at 31 December 2017 plus the assessed voluntary contributions for 2018 amounting to \$733,000, minus the contributions received (paragraph 7 above) and the cash disbursed during the first four months of the year. This brings the reserves and fund balance as at 30 April 2018 to \$2,380,942.

18. The reserves and fund balance for the Trust Fund for the Montreal Protocol as at 31 December 2017 was \$7,944,967. A detailed explanation of the reserves and fund balance will be provided in the financial report for the trust funds for the Vienna Convention and the Montreal Protocol for the fiscal year 2017 (UNEP.OzL.Pro.30/5). In brief, that balance is the result of the contributions by the Government of Canada for hosting the joint eleventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Vienna Convention and the Twenty-Ninth Meeting of the Parties to the Montreal Protocol, and parties paying their contributions in arrears. The reserves and fund balance as at 30 April 2018 (table 2) is derived from the reserves and fund balance as at 31 December 2017 plus the assessed voluntary contributions for 2018 which amount to \$5,546,722, minus the contributions received (paragraph 7 above) and the cash disbursed during the first four months of the year. This brings the reserves and fund balance as at 30 April 2018 to \$12,463,835.

19. The cash balance, which includes cash, cash equivalents, investments and non-current investments and forms part of the fund balance, amounted to \$1,461,341 as at 31 December 2017 for the Trust Fund for the Vienna Convention. This amount, in addition to the contributions received and the cash spent during the first four months of the year, brings the cash balance as at 30 April 2018 to \$1,460,242.

20. The cash balance, which includes cash, cash equivalents, investments and non-current investments and forms part of the fund balance, amounted to \$5,296,701 as at 31 December 2017 for the Trust Fund for the Montreal Protocol. This amount, in addition to the contributions received and the cash spent during the first four months of the year, brings the cash balance as at 30 April 2018 to \$6,846,064.

21. Interest earned on the trust funds is recorded twice a year, in June and December, hence no report is given on interest as at 30 April 2018.

IV. Interim budget performance report

22. Annex II to the present note lists the actual expenditures and commitments – the interim budget performance report – against the approved budget for the fiscal year 2018 for the trust funds for the Vienna Convention and the Montreal Protocol as at 30 April 2018. The budget utilization rate as at 30 April 2018 was 28 per cent for the Trust Fund for the Vienna Convention and 24 per cent for the Trust Fund for the Montreal Protocol.
